April 15, 1925 - July 26, 2010

Christine Klock, 85, went home to be with her Lord and Savior on Monday, July 26, 2010. Christine Camp was born in Tea, SD on April 15, 1925 to John and Hilka (Frerichs) Camp. She moved to rural Lennox in 1939, graduating from Lennox High School in 1942. She married Harold Klock on April 20, 1944 and lived in the Chancellor area all her married life. In 1970 she graduated from Southern State College (magna cum laude) and taught elementary school in Parker and in Chancellor until retiring in 1983.
