June 24, 1926 - January 9, 2022

Dorothy "Dot" DeVries, 95, of Lennox, SD, died Sunday, January 9, 2022 at the Good Samaritan Prairie Creek Memory Care, Sioux Falls, SD.

Dorothy June Plucker was born on June 24, 1926, at Princeton, IL, the daughter of Menno Elvin and Dena Margaret (Thaden) Plucker. She grew and attended school near Lennox, graduating from Lennox High School in 1944. She went on to earn her teaching certificate and then taught rural school in Turner county for two years.

On May 19, 1946 she was united in marriage to Eddie Thomas DeVries at Germantown Presbyterian Church, rural Chancellor, SD. The couple made their home on a farm northeast of Chancellor for 38 years, before moving into Lennox in 1984. Husband, Eddie died on May 25, 1994.

Dorothy was an active and faithful member of Germantown Presbyterian Church where she had served as church pianist for a short time, Sunday school teacher for many years, sang in the choir and served in various church committees and women's organizations. She enjoyed quilting, singing and walking. Dorothy was a devoted wife and mother, who deeply loved her family. Besides her parents and husband, Eddie, Dorothy was preceded in death by three children: daughters, Faye Bossman in 2010, Nola DeVries in 2016 and son, Dale DeVries in 2017 and one sister, Jean Plucker-Straatmeyer in 2021.
