Esther Buse, 85 of Lennox, South Dakota died Saturday, April 20, 2013 at the Lennox Good Samaritan Center. Esther Haupt was born on July 5, 1927 on a farm near Wellsburg, Iowa, the daughter of August and Kate (Murra) Haupt. She grew up on the farm in the Wellsburg area attending rural grade school and graduating from high school in Eldora, Iowa. On September 8, 1948 she committed herself in marriage to Vernon Buse of Lennox, South Dakota. They lived on a farm southwest of Lennox, where they raised their three children, Lorna, Arla and Dale. Vernon died on March 29, 1979. Esther moved into Lennox in 1981 where she had since made her home.
