Gary Sather, 73, of Lennox, SD, died Wednesday, May 31, 2017 at the Sanford USD Medical Center, Sioux Falls, after a courageous four year battle with a rare cancer. Gary Blaine Sather was born at Sioux Falls, SD, on February 12, 1944, the son of Lester and Esther (Urban) Sather of Lennox, SD. He graduated from Lennox High School in 1962. He served in the SD Army National Guard in Canton, SD, from 1965-1971. He worked for Jack Batho, Sr. from 1965-1978, before starting Lennox Plumbing and Heating. On November 23, 1973, he was united in marriage to Virginia "Ginger" Lemke at Zion Lutheran Church, Sioux Falls. The couple made their home in Lennox.
