Larry Schultz, 63, of Sioux Falls, SD, died Friday, September 24, 2021 at Sanford USD Medical Center, Sioux Falls.

Larry Allen Schultz was born on December 19, 1957, at Parkston, SD, the son of Nathanael and Delores (Wudel) Schultz. He grew up and attended school here, graduating from Parkston High School in 1976. Larry went on to graduate from the SD Police Academy. He worked as a police officer in Parkston and Tripp before relocating to Sioux Falls, where he worked for John Morrell and Co. for a short time. He then worked as Police Officer in Lennox, where he then became Chief of Police for a number of years. He then served as a Police Officer in Tea and for many years at the Sturgis Bike Rally.
