Louise Lohse, 85, of Lennox, SD, died Friday, April 21, 2017 at the Lennox Good Samaritan Center. Louise Emma Pillar was born on May 7, 1931, at Clayton, SD, the daughter of Adolf and Margaret (Stern) Pillar. As a young girl, she moved with her family to Freeman, SD and attended St. Paul's Lutheran School. She then moved to Sioux Falls where she was employed at McKennan Hospital and Manchester Biscuit Co. She returned to South Dakota and was employed at Prince of Peace Nursing Home for 12 years and Trail Ridge Retirement Home for over 9 years, retiring in 2012. Louise was a member of First English Lutheran Church and the Lennox Senior Citizens. She was a Minnesota Twins fan and had a love for cats. She also enjoyed flowers, puzzles, reading and crocheting. Besides her parents and husband Joseph, she was preceded in death by siblings: Erna Schmidt in 1973, Alvina Dunham in 2001 and Henry Pillar in 2012; one niece and two nephews.
