May 31, 1959 - April 15, 2024

Lowell Beebe, age 64, of Sioux Falls, SD, passed away, at his home, April 15, 2024, under hospice care, following a lengthy and courageous battle with cancer.

Lowell Edward Beebe was born in Sioux Falls, SD, on May 31, 1959, the son of James and Eunice (Thompson) Beebe. He grew up and attended school in Sioux Falls and then graduated from Washington High School in 1977. Lowell entered service into the SD Army National Guard where he served for over 16 years. Lowell was employed as a truck driver in the food service industry. On August 5, 2006, he was united in marriage to Charity Reinartz. The couple spent their honeymoon recovering from a motorcycle accident that occurred near Wall, SD, just one day after their wedding. The couple made their home in Worthing and Sioux Falls until relocating to Forsyth, MO, near Branson, where Lowell began work at Silver Dollar City Amusement Park, first as a tram conductor and then in warehouse delivery. They moved back to Sioux Falls in 2022.

Lowell's priorities were his family, friends and helping others. He enjoyed playing softball and golf for many years. He was a loyal Harley-Davidson owner who enjoyed riding locally and attending the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally yearly. Lowell and Charity enjoyed vacationing, cruises and travel mostly where there was an ocean, specifically Mexico and the Caribbean. Lowell's eclectic taste and diverse interests lead to time spent at museums, including several weekend get-a-ways, to Murdo, SD and the Murdo Auto Museum. He

enjoyed card games, especially Pinochle, croquet with his grandkids and holiday decorating. He was preceded in death by his parents.
