



## Mae Strasser

December 8, 1915 - August 10, 2013

Mae Strasser, 97, died Saturday, August 10, 2013 at Sanford Centennial Hospice Cottage in Sioux Falls, SD. Mae Beatrice Strasser was born on a farm in Turner County, southwest of Lennox, South Dakota on December 8, 1915, the daughter of George and Bertha (Krull) Strasser. She attended Vietor District #20 rural school and grew up there. Mae and her twin sister, Myrtle, moved to Sioux Falls in 1941. Mae was employed at Shipley's, Golden Rule Bakery and later at John Morrell & Company in the canning department for 30 years, retiring in 1978. She and Myrtle moved to Lennox in May of 2000. Mae was a faithful member of First Reformed Church in Sioux Falls. She did volunteer work at the Union Gospel Mission and also knitted, caps, scarves and mittens for Goodwill Industries. She was preceded in death by her mother in 1953, her father in 1966, two sisters, Louise Reiners in 1994 and her twin, Myrtle, in 2007; her three brothers-in-law: Dick Reiners, Arnold "Ole" Siepkes and Alvin Bultena. Grateful for having shared her life are two sisters, Bernice Bultena and Dorothy Siepkes, both of Lennox; her brother, David Strasser and his wife, Shirley, of Wausau, Wisconsin; plus her nieces and nephews, other relatives and friends.
