



## Marvin Heibult

October 28, 1918 - August 7, 2010

Marvin Heibult, 91, died Saturday, August 7, 2010 at the Lennox Good Samaritan Center following a brief illness. Marvin A. Heibult was born on October 28, 1918 on the family farm near Parker, SD, the son of George H. and Gertie (Weeldreyer) Heibult. He attended Germantown rural school District #86 and Chancellor High School. He served in the US Army with the 8th Cavalry, during World War II, attaining the rank of Staff Sergeant. On September 8, 1945 he was united in marriage to Grace Andernacht at Germantown Manse, rural Chancellor. Following their marriage they farmed most of their married life near Parker until retiring into Lennox in 1981. His wife died on April 4, 2002, ending a marriage of over 56 years. Marvin was an active-lifetime member of Germantown Presbyterian Church. He was also a member of Bertus-Jurgens American Legion Post #283 in Chancellor. He was preceded in death by his father and mother in 1964; two brothers: Harold Heibult in 2002 and Alfred Heibult in 2007 Grateful for having shared his life are his four children and their spouses: Roger and Jan Heibult of Aurora, Colorado, Bob and Susan Heibult of Sturgis, Verlyn and Loyanne Heibult of Parker and Cheryl and Mike Immeker of Brandon; seven grandchildren: Jason (Amanda), Scott (Molly), Amanda and Sarah Heibult, Emily (Zach) Hertel, Tyler and Ryan Immeker; three step-grandchildren: Jessica and Joshua Immeker and Karissa (Adam) Kaskie; five great-grandchildren; three sisters-in-law: Rena Heibult of Sioux Falls, Dorothy Heibult of Lennox and Jo Andernacht of Viborg.
