Roy Abbas, 86, died Monday, June 5, 2017 at his Lennox, SD, home. Roy Leland Abbas was born on July 8, 1930, the son of Harry and Annie (Peterson) Abbas. He attended Chancellor Public School. Roy entered the U.S. Army in 1952, during the Korean War, and served until his honorable discharge in 1953. On February 10, 1956 he married Lena Wildeboer.
