Russel Heibult, 65, died Friday, April 29, 2011 at Covington Heights Nursing Home in Sioux Falls, SD. Russel Dean Heibult was born, the son of Alfred and Dorothy (Kuhlmeier) Heibult, on February 23, 1946 at the home of his grandmother, Kate, in Lennox, SD. He grew up north of Chancellor where he attended rural school and then graduated from Chancellor High School in 1964. He served in the US Army from November of 1965 to October of 1968. Following his discharge, in addition to farming, he was employed at Terrace Park Dairy in Sioux Falls. In 1969 Russel was married to Janet Pederson and three children were born to this union, Kristie, Lonnie and Jennifer. They made their home in Sioux Falls, Tea and Chancellor. Russel was married to June Burgess in 1997 and they made their home in Centerville. He had been a member of Germantown Presbyterian Church, rural Chancellor and was currently a member of Bertus-Jurgens American Legion Post #283 in Chancellor. Those who knew Russel for years were aware of his generous spirit, his love of family and his enjoyment of horses. Russel was preceded in death by his father, Alfred, on November 15, 2007. His mother, Dorothy, died one day after Russel , on April 30, 2011. Survivors are his three children: Kristie (Bill) Beck of Tenecula, CA, Lonnie (Angi) Heibult of Sioux Falls and Jennifer (Ryan) Sawchuk of Seattle, WA; six grandchildren: Brock, Josh, Paige, Elle, Austin and Avery; one sister: Joylene (Gary) Spencer of Eden Prairie, MN; one nephew: Paul (Jennifer) Spencer and one niece: Katie Spencer; plus other relatives and friends. Services will begin at 10:30 a.m.
