



## Spencer Wenbourne

April 18, 1949 - January 3, 2022

Spencer Wenbourne, 72, died unexpectedly, Monday, January 3, 2022, of natural causes, at his rural Beresford, SD, home.

Spencer Allan Wenbourne was born on April 18, 1949, at Sioux Falls, SD, the son of Archie and Selma (Fodness) Wenbourne. He grew up on a farm north of Beresford, attending rural school and then graduated from Worthing High School in 1967. He went on to earn a vocational degree in small engine repair from a school in Little Rock, Arkansas. Spencer worked at McCord Heat Transfer (now Adam's Thermal) in Canton, SD. He was also self employed in a small engine repair business.

On date September 16, 1988, he was united in marriage to Angela Olson at Yankton, SD. The couple made their home in Canton until moving to the family farm, rural Beresford in 1998.

Spencer was raised in the Lutheran faith at West Prairie Lutheran Church. He was an active member of the Canton Optimist International volunteer organization. He was also active in the Granite Threshermen's Association, Granite, IA and the Menno Pioneer Power Show, Menno, SD. Spencer had an extensive farm toy collection. He was a devoted husband and brother, who deeply loved his family.

Besides his parents, Spencer was preceded in death by a brother-in-law, John Sweere and a sister-in-law, Gail Wenbourne.
